# Principal's Message:

## Online bullying is never okay

Bullying is when someone says or does something unkind or unsafe to someone else. When bullying happens on a device, like a computer or mobile phone, this is called online bullying or cyberbullying.

Someone is bullying you online if they: call you names, say rude, nasty or mean things about you to other people, spread rumours or lies about you to other people, make you feel unsafe, make you feel embarrassed, keep contacting you when you don't want them to, share pictures or videos of you that you don't like, pretend to be you to make you look bad.

## But you can get help if it happens to you.

- 1. Talk to someone you trust, like your support staff, whānau or a friend.
- 2. Save messages and images. Take a screen shot, or ask someone else to do it for you.
- 3. Report it directly to the social media app or website where it happened. You can ask someone else to help if you don't know how.
- 4. Ask for help to block any phone numbers that are being used to send you nasty messages.
- Contact Netsafe for advice.

#### What happens when you contact?

Netsafe will: 1. Ask you questions to understand what has been happening to you. 2. Talk about ways to stop the abuse. 3. Suggest other people you can talk to who may be able to help.
