PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Enrolling for High School

Please make sure that you have enrolled your year 8 child for High School by the end of November. This is very important because leaving it til 2024 may result in your child not being able to attend their in-zone school.

We had several students this year who left their enrollment too late and were not able to enrol even though they were living in-zone.

Enrolments can be done online through the School's website.

Compulsory Documents:

- NZ Birth Certificate or NZ Passport (if not born in New Zealand - Visa & Passport is required)
- Proof of Address - must be current – less than 6 months - with your (parent/caregiver) name and address from a Government Department, eg. IRD, NZTA, Housing NZ, Work & Income or a power or telephone account—if these accounts are emailed to you, you can print them off as most have the address on them. Schools do not accept the following
 - bank or insurance statements, fundraising organisation letters or parcel delivery slips.
- Guardianship proof if required - If you are not the student's biological parent schools will require proof that the student is allowed to stay with you e.g. a Statutory Declaration from the Manukau Courts OR an official document from Court/Oranga Tamariki/WINZ Unsupported Child.

Additional Supporting Documents:

- Immunisation Record - Please let the school know if the student is NOT immunised.
- Previous School Report

This programme is a tutoring education scheme that intervenes in a young person's education at two key transition points - from full primary/intermediate to high school and high school to tertiary study or in further training or employment.



After spending the morning at AUT, the students had a delicious pizza lunch and then walked up to the Sky Tower. If 51 stories wasn't high enough, all our CPS students took another elevator to the 61st floor. The experience was certainly a thrilling one!

If you're interested in joining the MATES programme, the next intake is in February 2024. We are excited about our ongoing relationship with MATES and look forward to seeing more students benefit from this fantastic programme.
