And hats off to Chris & David, our MVPs!



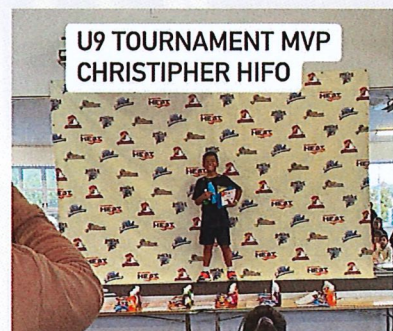

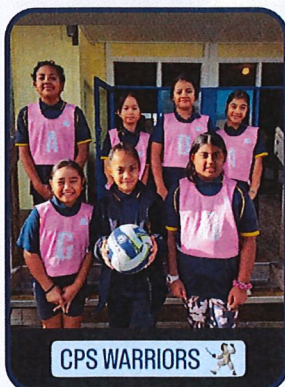

EXCITING NEWS FROM CPS NETBALL TEAMS!

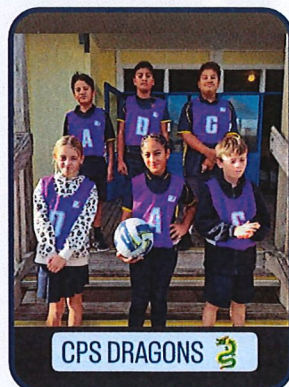

Training has already commenced, and we're proud to say that all our teams have been working extra hard to bring their A-game to every match.

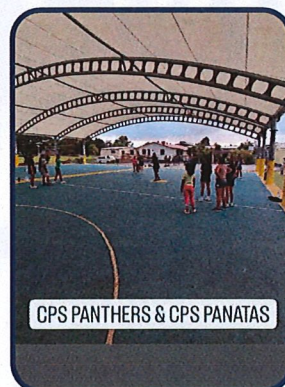
